### How to Get Out the Count as a Health Center

The 2020 Census is coming to an end soon and we need YOU to help us get out the count! We want ALL New Yorkers counted. Let's take these efforts statewide. Let's have every corner of NYS blanketed with a range of final get out the count activities. These ten days of action will encourage every resident of the Empire State to self-respond and bridge that 3.5% gap between NY's self-response rate and the national self-response rate.

We have until the end of this month to get our community counted! We must make sure New York receives the funding and political representation it deserves for the next TEN years! See below easy-lift ideas you can take to help us secure a fair count in the next 10 days.

"I have no time" ideas	
Add Census awareness to your pre-existing activities	<p>If you're interacting with others in-person or virtually, talk about the census at any event! Simply take 5 minutes at the beginning of any event or meeting and remind everyone about the importance of the census and to complete it at <a href="https://2020census.gov">2020census.gov</a></p> <p>Need to refine your census messaging? Post about the census on all social media channels (don't forget about Snapchat and TikTok!)	<p>Need some graphics? Have staff update their email signatures with census & auto-reply message with census information	<p>Feel free to write your own, or use this pre-crafted version: <i>Have you completed the 2020 Census yet? It's just 9 questions and takes less than 10 minutes.</i></p> <p>Visit <a href="https://www.my2020Census.gov">www.my2020Census.gov</a> to get counted today!</p>
If operating in person, hang up a poster in your office or post a yard sign outside your offices	<p>Find ready-to-print posters <a href="#">here</a> and even more <a href="#">here</a></p>

	<p><a href="#">Here</a> and <a href="#">here</a> you can find health-focused census posters.</p> <p>Additionally, find flyers in an assortment of languages <a href="#">here</a>, census-themed coloring sheets <a href="#">here</a>, a half-sheet flyer that lets them know <a href="#">how to fill it out</a>, and a flyer that explains <a href="#">how to identify a Census taker</a>.</p> <p>And last, don't forget about any electric billboard or screens near you! Make sure those have a census message too.</p>
Lay out literature in your waiting room or gathering center	Find handouts to lay out in your waiting room <a href="#">here</a> . Or have some census-themed <a href="#">coloring sheets</a> available for any children that visit.
Give your staff time to complete the census	Give your staff 10-15 minutes to complete the census on behalf of their family. Or to text 5 friends or family members reminders to complete the census at <a href="http://2020census.gov">2020census.gov</a> .
<b>"I can spare an hour or two" Ideas</b>	
Send an email blast to your network or include a census message in newsletter you send	<p>Include a paragraph explaining why the Census is important to your organization or community in your monthly newsletter or dedicated email blasts. Find a sample email template <a href="#">here</a>.</p> <p>Need to refine your census messaging? Where appropriate, train front line staff to answer basic questions.	Encourage staff to bring up the Census as part of regular conversations with your community. These Census <a href="#">talking points</a> and <a href="#">Census fact sheets</a> are perfect for prepping them for such conversations.
Educate your staff, board, and volunteers.	Add a discussion about the importance of the 2020 Census to the agenda of your next board meeting, staff meeting, and/or volunteer gathering. Meeting

Add a census banner to your webpage.	This makes it easy for anyone who visits your website to respond. <a href="#">Click here to download ready-to-post graphics.</a>
Record a video in a non-English language about the census and share it	Have a special language skill you provide to your community? Use that skill! See <a href="#">here</a> from an example message from Cardi B in Spanish!
<b>“I have time, let’s do this!” Ideas</b>	
If operating in-person, host a census pop up at your location.	Are your offices open to the public? Make computers or tablets available for participants to fill out the 2020 Census during regularly scheduled service hours. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, be sure to adhere to state and municipality guidelines, including proper sanitation procedures. Host a census drive-through	Not operating in person but still like the idea of a census pop-up? Perhaps a census drive-through is the event for you. See <a href="#">this guide</a> for how to host a census pop-up event- just make it a drive through instead!
